Dacryocystorhinostomy (DCR) Post-operative Care & Advice





1 Always wash your hands before applying any medication

2 Perform eye dressing / wound dressing (1 week)





3 Apply eye drops / ointment to the wound as instructed

4 Can watch TV







5 Can do computer work

6 Can do near work (e.g. reading / writing / needlework)







Suck on small ice cube / drink cold water to prevent bleeding

8 Simple cooking is fine (no deep frying)

Shower / bathe but avoid water touching the wound site / entering eye







10 Look out for any signs of active bleeding / oozing of blood (that lasts longer than 15 minutes) from the wound site / nose

If you wear spectacles, rest it a little further down the nose to avoid touching the wound





1 Don't rub / press on eye and wound site



2 Don't apply make-up



6 Avoid hot food / drinks for 24-48 hours



6 Don't exercise (2 weeks)



3 Don't splash water into



Avoid sports (2 weeks)



8 Avoid strenuous work / don't lift heavy objects (2 weeks)







4 Don't bend

forward (2 weeks)

9 Avoid carrying young children who may accidentally poke your eye



10 Do not blow or sneeze through your nose as this may cause bleeding from the operated site



IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- · Following DCR operation (you may experience the following for a few days):
 - Stuffy nose
 - Slight tinkling sensation inside the nose (stent)
 - Some blood stained discharge (nasal pack)
 - Slight skin redness and swelling
- Avoid crowded or dusty places

- Should you experience or notice any of the following symptoms, please seek medical attention immediately:
 - Pain not relieved by medication
 - Significant blurring of vision
 - Severe swelling of the eyelid or excessive oozing
 - Nose bleeding that cannot stop with compression
